

MAA Internship Deliverables Examples

Below is an ongoing list of internship deliverables produced by previous MAA students, organized by the nature of the internship (*Applied Internship* or *Research Practicum*) and the area of concentration (Health, Heritage, Environment).

Examples of Deliverables for all categories:

- Professional conference presentation

Examples of *Applied Internship* Deliverables:

Environment

- Policy analysis
- Extension publication
- Data management (organized for project continuance)
- Clean master datasets
- Case study write ups
- Agency/organization report on project research
- Website development
- StoryMap
- Arboretum tours (medicinals, mind-altering, native plants)

Health

- Presentations of independent research to relevant audiences
 - Staff at the organization where the student completed the internship (e.g., Community Health Center, Student Health Center, Non-profit Organizations that requested data on an issue of interest)
- Analytic report on project research submitted to community collaborator
- Art installation in combination with scholarly paper
- Brochures or flyers with condensed data or study information for a general audience

Heritage

- Technical/CRM reports
- Write up a Determination of Eligibility (DOE) application for a historic site
- Summary of an architectural survey
- Photodocumentation of artifacts/photogrammetry documentation
- Web pages (e.g., National Register properties)

Examples of *Research Practicum* Deliverables:

Environment

- Results report
 - Could be used by faculty advisor to turn into a publishable manuscript
 - Including tables and graphs for a research project or publishable manuscript

Health

- An analysis of data collected independently, analyzed, and written in the form of a scholarly paper that could be used for a future peer reviewed manuscript.

Heritage

- Zooarchaeology students analyze an assemblage and write up their analysis.
 - The final products are independent research written up in long form with accompanying data tables/figures.

**If a student's deliverables are substantively greater than the minimum requirement (presentation at the Department of Anthropology Annual Colloquium, and a substantive independently-written product), the advisor may propose that the student register for independent study credits (ANTH689A) in the spring semester of the second year.*
